

Trends in Graduate Research in Family & Consumer Sciences

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This workshop will describe the survey to collect the titles of theses and dissertations in family and consumer sciences that were completed in 2012. In May 2013, 27 universities responded to the survey. A total of 279 theses and 146 dissertations were recorded. The presenters will explain which areas in FCS produced the most theses and dissertations, how this has changed in the last 10 years, and how this list can be a resource for educators and researchers. The list of titles and a “trends in graduate research productivity” are published each December in the *Family & Consumer Sciences Research Journal*. The presenters are MJ Kabaci, author of the two articles, and Sharon A. DeVaney, Editor of FCSRJ.
